Albert Crocker worked initially for the Aurora Machine Company, maker of Thor motorcycles. He then embarked on a career with the Indian Company, finally locating in Los Angeles, CA as the distributor for this company. Crocker relinquished his association with Indian to build speedway machines. He then embarked on designing and building a "super-bike", using his experience with the Indian brand. Hand-built to order, the Crocker was described as the Duesenberg of American motorcycles. Able to cruise between 90-100 mph, the Crocker was phenomenal. Approximately 75 machines were built between 1936 and 1940 with about one half accounted for today.
