I never dreamed that I would one day get to know them and compete with some of them.


For those that do not know the history of the Peach Bowl Speedway, it was build for midget in 1949. It was a flat 1/4 mile dirt track located in downtown Atlanta at the corner of Howell Mill road and Brady avenue. In the early 1950s the promoter experimented with rack cars and was such a success that eventually the midgets faded and cars took over. Cars were rough on the dirt so in latter part of 1950 the promoter had it paved.

All the drivers will agree that Roy Shoemaker was one of the best promoter of speedway they ever raced for. To me, he was also a visionary. In the latter part of the 1950 season he realized he needed a support group for the professional racers so he started an amateur division. This continued until the track finally closed at the end of the 1971 season.

I can not stress the importance of this tiny track in downtown Atlanta. In the lobby of the Georgia Racing Hall of Fame in Dawsonville there is a 5x9 foot wall plaque with 360 names on it dedicated to the drivers of the Peach Bowl Speedway. These names were take from the Atlanta newspapers and represents only a partial list of those that actually raced there.

All the driver s I listed as my heroes have been inducted into the Georgia Hall of Fame. Of the first 40 inductees, 25 had a connection to the Peach Bowl Speedway.

Drivers that raced at the Peach Bowl in the past that may be at the Peach Bowl Reunion will be Rex White, Leon Sells, Bruce Brantley, Bud Lunsford, Billy Long



Roscoe Smith, Mike Head and many more.

Officials withe the Georgia Automobile Racing Hall of Fame Association will there with their display of photos of Peach Bowl cars and drivers. They will also have a large selection of photos albums for your enjoyment. You will be able to renew your annual membership and join our Association.
