## Martin Truex Jr. and his Pocono 400 win

LONG POND, Pa. —Staying out under caution on Lap 140 of 160, Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series champion, Martin Truex Jr. restarted with seven laps left and with clean air held off Kyle Larson to win the race and put himself into the title conversation.

Kevin Harvick lead a racehigh 89 laps. Kyle Busch won the race off pit road on Lap 126 and led up till the debris caution came out at lap 139 when sheet metal from #19-Daniel Suarez changed the course of the race.

Busch finished third and Harvick fourth. With the victory, Truex's and his #78 Toyota let Harvick and Busch know he's back!.

This was Truex for the second time at Pocono, the second time this season and the 17th time in his career. Harvick, Busch and Truex have triumphed in 11 of the 14 Cup races this year.

In the media center after his champagne shower and hat dance Truex said;"It's always fun to win, but especially when you beat the best guys out there. Those two guys (Busch and Harvick) were so fast today. Honestly, we were all really equal. It was a matter of who could get out front. We felt like in practice we were really fast on scuffs. "Crew chief" Cole Pearn made a good call to stay out, and once I got in clean air, this thing was a rocket ship."

Brad Keselowski ran fifth,

followed by Pole winner Blaney, Aric Almirola and Jimmie Johnson, who led his first two laps of the season during the first exchange of green-flag pit stops. Busch leads the series by 87 points over Harvick in second and 90 over Joey Logano (ninth Sunday) in third.

KYLE BUSCH, No. 18 Comcast Salute to Service Juniper Toyota Camry was the class of the field on Saturday. Here are some quotes after the race:
